Academic Diploma with Honors

Diplomas with Honors requirements pre-suppose completion of all high school diploma requirements. Students need to fulfill all but one of the following (8) criteria:

- ◆ Earn four (4) units of English, including at least two years of Honors or AP
- ◆ Earn four (4) units of Math, including Algebra I, Honors Geometry, Honors Algebra II or equivalent and another higher level course or a four-year sequence of courses that contains equivalent content
- ◆ Earn four (4) units of Social Studies
- ◆ Earn either three (3) units of one foreign language or two (2) units each of two (2) foreign languages
- ◆ Earn one (1) unit of Fine Arts
- ◆ Earn at least a 3.5 on a 4.0 scale
- ◆ Earn at least a 27 on the ACT (excluding the optional writing test) or a combined score of 1210 on the SAT verbal and mathematics sections (excluding the required writing section)
