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FY26 Fall Forecast Assumptions

- 1. Line 1.010 Real Estate Tax
 - a. Residential Assume Clinton County and Clermont County reappraisal in CY2026 at 10% and in CY2029 5%. If future state legislation limits growth on property taxes, this rate will be affected. Adjustments may be required in the future.
 - b. Agriculture Assume Clinton County and Clermont County reappraisal in CY2026 at 10% and 4.6% in FY2029. If future state legislation limits growth on property taxes, this rate will be affected. Adjustments may be required in the future.
- Line 1.020 PUPP HB15 will limit growth. Taxable value will decrease by 70% for new property placed in service in tax year 2027 and beyond. The forecast was reduced from an average rate increase of nearly 2.5% to .74% in 2027 forward.
- Line 1.030 Income Tax we are modeling 2% growth in FY27 through FY30. Assumes levy falls off in FY2029. Final phase in occurred in FY2026.
- 4. State Funding
 - a. Line 1.035 Unrestricted
 - i. Performance Bonus FY26 and FY27 estimated at \$62k per year.
 - ii. Catastrophic / Threshold Funding estimated at \$65k per year.
 - iji. Funding will remain relatively flat.
 - Funding Guarantee will continue to increase from \$2.6 million in FY2026 up to \$4.2 million in FY2030.

b. Line 1.040 Restricted

- Gifted Funding will reduce each year from 46% in FY2026 down to 36% FY2030.
- DPIA funding will be flat around 50% through each year of the forecast.
- iii. Transportation funding will be flat. The district is on the guarantee each <u>year by</u> from \$204k in FY2026 to \$163k in FY2030. Total funding will ramain at \$796k.

5. Line 1.060 Other funds

a. Interest rates are expected to decrease to 3% by December 2026. This will
negatively impact the district's interest earnings.

b. Medicaid Reimbursements are estimated at \$150,000.00 per year. Settlements for prior years occur and are difficult to predict. FY25 received two settlements for a total of \$393k, however, prior fiscal year's received one settlement for approximately \$90k. FY2026 will likely not receive a settlement since two came in FY25.

- Line 2.060 All other financing sources are reduced from \$52k in FY25 to \$5k in FY26.
 In FY25, the district moved several stells checks to unclaimed funds. These checks were receipted into the General Fund then transferred to Unclaimed Funds by board action.
- 7. Line 3.010 Personnel
 - The district is forecasting the negotiated agreement salary increases in FY2026.
 - In FY2027 through FY2030, the district has modeled a small increase each year for all personnel changes that includes inflation and staffing changes.
 - The district will be negotiating with both unions in CY2026. Any changes made to salaries in FY27 forward will affect this forecast.
 - d. In FY2026, the district will realize approximately \$150k in savings from several resignations / retirements. The district replaced these positions with lower paid employees.
 - In FY2026, the district added a new Kindergarten Teacher for a salary cost of \$47,600.00
 - f. In FY2026, the stronger connections grant will no longer be able to support our Crisis Prevention position. \$10k will be picked up by the General Fund. In FY2027, the General Fund will realize an additional \$21.5k for this position.

8. Line 3.020 Benefits

a. Health Insurance – In FY2026, the district received a 1.75% health insurance increase. This results in significant savings each year compared to the previous forecast. See the estimated savings in the graph below. The district is modeling 8% per year afterwards.

- Heath Saving Account maintaining the FY26 negotiated rates throughout this forecast.
 - Classified rate will decrease from 90% to 80% saving approximately \$24k.
- In FY2026, savings from the resignations + replacements saved the district approximately \$10k.
- d. The district will be negotiating with both unions in CY2026. Any changes made to <u>benefits</u> will affect this forecast.
- 9. Line 3.030 Purchased Services
 - a. Assumes a 5% increase per year.
 - Curriculum purchasing schedule was developed and included. FY26 \$387k, FY27 \$170k, FY28 \$235k, FY29 \$170k, FY30 \$50k.
- Line 3.040 Supplies Assumes a 5% increase per year. Computers are purchased annually from this object.
- 11. Line 3.050 Capital Outlay Assumes a 2.5% increase pear year. The permanent improvement fund will handle most capital outlay purchases. This object will be used when purchasing items that are eligible for E-Rate.
- Lines 4.010 & 4.060 Debt Service the district's final debt service payment for the Energy Conservation Bond is in FY2027.
- 13. Line 4.30 Other Objects
 - a. Dues and Fees increase estimated at 5% per year.
 - b. Property insurance increase is estimated at 10% per year.
- 14. Operating Transfers Out
 - a. Permanent Improvement
 - i. In FY26, the district will transfer \$850k to PI from General Fund.
 - The following transfers are planned: FY2027 \$950k, FY2028 \$950k, FY2029 \$950k, FY2030 \$750k.

- The transfers were reduced in FY2030 to keep the district at nearly 100 days of cash on hand.
- The district developed a long-term strategic plan for building improvements, equipment replacement, bus replacement, and technology upgrades.
- v. The district has older facilities that need updates and repairs. As the district leadership team continues to work through its long-term strategic plan, it is likely additional needs will be identified. The amount transferred from the General Fund may need to increase in future years.

b. Termination Benefits Fund

- \$100k per year will be transferred from General Fund to the Termination Benefits Fund to pay for severance for retiring employees.
- ii. In the event the fund has built up adequate funds, the transfer amount will be sent to permanent improvements in lieu of sending it to Termination Benefits from the General Fund.

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
