Bullying Incident Report Form

Rude Vs. Mean Vs. Bullying (Defining The Differences):

Rude = Inadvertently saying or doing something that hurts someone else.

Mean = Purposefully saying or doing something to hurt someone once (or maybe twice).

Bullying = Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time. Both kids who are bullied and who bully others may have serious, lasting problems.

In order to be considered bullying, the behavior must be aggressive and include:

- An **Imbalance of Power**: Kids who bully use their power—such as physical strength, access to embarrassing information, or popularity—to control or harm others. Power imbalances can change over time and in different situations, even if they involve the same people.
- **Repetition**: Bullying behaviors happen more than once or have the potential to happen more than once.

This is a form to report alleged incidents of bullying that has occured on school property, during a school sponsored activity or event off school property, on school transportation, or on the way to and from school, in the current school year.
