# Reminders for Arrival and Dismissal

## Daily Schedule

- Our doors open to students at 8:30 AM-Breakfast is available in the cafeteria.
- Our dismissal procedures begin at 3:30 PM
- Parents dropping off and picking up students use the driveway in front of Putman Elementary.
- Students who need to be picked up early contact the office prior to **2:00 PM**.
- Please contact the school office to get your ID Tag for your vehicle.



## Ohio Child Passenger Safety Laws

- Parents and caregivers are required by Ohio law to obey the following safety practices:
  - Infants and young children must ride in a child safety seat until they are 4 years old AND weigh at least 40 pounds.

- Every child ages 4-8 who is no longer in a car seat must use a booster seat until they reach 4'9" tall.
- Children and teens ages 8-15 who are not in booster seats must use adult seat belts.

## Arrival/Drop Off Procedures

- **Parents please focus on students. Do NOT be on your cell phone when students are getting in or out of your vehicle.**
- Parents will drop off student(s) in front of the building and students will enter the building. Parents will drive off continuing through the driveway. Staff members will assist students as they enter the building.
- Parents are **not permitted to park in the parking lot and drop their children off.**
- Parents are not to pass another vehicle in the drop off area.
- To avoid congestion on Columbus St. so buses can arrive promptly cars are to enter from West Baldwin St.
- **When exiting the parking lot after parent drop off or parent pick up always turn right onto Baldwin Street.**

# Dismissal/Pickup Procedures

- The only students that will be considered walkers are those students who walk. For example if your child is an open enrollment student or lives in the county, etc. your child would obviously not be eligible to be a walker and the parent will need to be in the pick up line. There will be no parking in front of the school. Walkers are only students that walk to school.
- **Parents please focus on students. Do NOT be on your cell phone when students are getting in or out of your vehicle.**
- To avoid congestion on Columbus St. so buses can arrive promptly cars are to enter from West Baldwin St.
- Parents will enter the driveway and travel to the end of the sidewalk with the school **Car Rider Tag**.
- Staff will bring students to the vehicle.
- Staff will **not release** students without a **Car Rider Tag**. Parents would need to park their vehicle in the designated area and contact the office for further instructions.

- Students will have a Key Tag attached to their backpack with the same **ID #** that matches the **Car Rider Tag**.

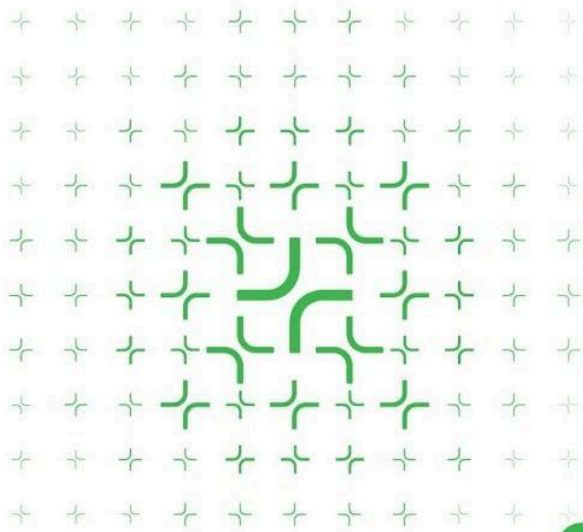

## Goal

The goal of Blanchester school district is that no student should miss any days of school without a legitimate excuse. A significant correlation exists between school attendance and academic and lifelong success. To help ensure that our students achieve that success, Blanchester school district has joined with all of the school districts in Clinton County in adopting a uniform attendance policy.

## VACATION

Parents are required to plan all vacations to correspond with the district calendar. In the event that a conflict exists, the parent must contact the principal's office in advance of the student's absence from school. **An educational option application must be approved and filed with the school one week prior to the absence.** Educational option applications cannot exceed five school days in one year. **All work assigned during the vacation must be completed and returned on the first day back to school.** [Educational Option Form](#)
